

## Exceptions in uAchieve

### Condition codes and how to use them

Condition codes are used to tag specific circumstances that courses must meet in order to apply in degree programs, requirements, and other encoding. For example:

- C or better grade
- Non-transfer course
- 4-unit courses
- Honors courses

Commonly used condition codes at UC San Diego include:

- b – assigned to 4-unit and higher courses
- U – assigned to UCSD courses
- X – assigned to PA/NP graded courses
- T – assigned to approximated transfer course work
- t – assigned to unapproximated transfer course work
- e – assigned to EAP course work
- C – assigned to courses with grades of 'C-' or better
- d – assigned to courses with grades of 'D+', 'D' or 'D-'

These condition codes are entered on exception forms in either Accept or Reject lines:

The accept lines are labeled AC1 & AC2 or Accept Code 1 & Accept Code 2.

The reject lines are labeled RC1 & RC2 or Reject Code 1 & Reject Code 2.

By entering condition codes in the accept or reject lines you are telling the system to change the attribute of courses to either allow or disallow usage.

The various How-To's show you which code to place in which area to achieve the desired result.
