

## ***In Brief***

The University of California, San Diego (UCSD), continues to reflect its leadership among the nation's leading research institutions. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the University received \$627.0 million to support a wide variety of research, instruction and public service programs. UCSD is second in the University of California system in federal awards, at \$507.9 million, and second in the University of California system in federal expenditures, at \$328.7 million.

The table below shows UCSD's national research standings for ten fiscal years, 1991-1992 through 2000-2001. The University has consistently ranked between fifth and eighth in the nation during this period, as shown in the National Science Foundation's *Annual Report of Federal Obligations for Research and Development*.
