

In Brief

The University of California, San Diego (UCSD), continues to reflect its leadership among the nation's leading research institutions. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004, the University received \$639.5 million to support a wide variety of research, instruction and public service programs. UCSD is second in the University of California system in federal awards, at \$503.3 million, and second in the University of California system in federal expenditures, at \$367.5 million.

The table below shows UCSD's national research standings for ten fiscal years, 1992-1993 through 2001-2002. The University has consistently ranked between fifth and eighth in the nation during this period, as shown in the National Science Foundation's *Annual Report of Federal Obligations for Research and Development*.
