

In Brief

The University of California, San Diego (UCSD), continues to reflect its leadership among the nation's leading research institutions. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, the University received \$728.4 million to support a wide variety of research, instruction and public service programs. UCSD is second in the University of California system in federal awards, at \$539.8 million, and second in the University of California system in federal expenditures, at \$381.6 million.

The table below shows UCSD's national research standings for ten fiscal years, 1993-1994 through 2002-2003. The University has consistently ranked between fifth and eighth in the nation during this period, as shown in the National Science Foundation's *Annual Report of Federal Obligations for Research and Development*.
