

In Brief

The University of California, San Diego (UCSD), continues to reflect its leadership among the nation's leading research institutions. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, the University received \$828.8 million to support a wide variety of research, instruction and public service programs. UCSD is third in the University of California system in federal awards, at \$567.1 million, and third in the University of California system in federal expenditures, at \$402.3 million.

The table below shows UCSD's national research expenditures for ten fiscal years. The University has consistently ranked between **fifth and tenth** in the nation during this period, as shown in the National Science Foundation's *Annual Report of Federally-Financed R&D Expenditures at Universities and Colleges*.
