Head Protection:

Foot Protection:

Carrying/handling heavy materials that could be dropped	✓	✓	✓

Sharp objects (nails, wires, tacks, screws, staples, scrap metal)	n/a	n/a	✓

*In some situations, metatarsal protection should be provided.

*Electrical conductive or insulating shoes may be appropriate for specific conditions.
