# Tips and Tricks for a Sustainable Holiday

#### 9 Core Tips

- 1. Sustainable holiday gift wrap
- 2. Sustainable gifts (Check our guide!), including stocking stuffers and cards
- 3. Eco Friendly feast (plan it out, no plastics, donate unused items, share leftovers, compost)
- 4. Get an organic real tree from a sustainable tree farm that plants more trees than it cuts down (or use a plastic one for more than 20 years)
- 5. Recycle or replant the tree (if possible) after Christmas
- 6. Sustainable Christmas decorations
- 7. Switch to LED Holiday lights and a timer
- 8. Recyclable cards or ecards that also plant trees with each purchase!
- 9. Adjust your thermostat to save energy

#### Reduce Waste around Meals

- Buy and **prepare** the right amount of food
- Try out this **tool** for determining how much food you need: https://savethefood.com/guestimator
- Stick to your **shopping list** and opt for items in recyclable packaging
- Give all produce a chance!
  - Don't only choose perfect produce. Also, check out <u>Imperfect Foods</u>
- Shop local and try out local farmers' markets
- Plant based meals and smaller portion sizes are ideal
  - o Use smaller plates and bowls
- Provide **leftover containers** for guests
  - o Use recyclable foil instead of plastic wrap for leftovers
- Donate unused food and used cooking oil (don't pour this down the drain!)
  - o WasteFreeSD.org
- Freeze excess leftovers that probably won't get eaten in time
- Use real dinnerware

## Tips for Green Holiday Shopping

- Shop close to home if possible or from stores close to delivery point
- Give an eco-friendly gift!
- Give gifts that encourage others to use less stuff
  - Cookbook for leftovers, crafts from reusable items, re-usable takeout containers; check our guide!
- Long-lasting gifts; no batteries required; or can be recycled once used
- Give apps to kids with smartphones
- Gift certificates for experiences instead of material things

- Museums, concerts, restaurants, subscriptions to content, theaters, online movies/shows, lessons, concert, zoo, sports
- Make a gift
  - Edible gifts like bread, cookies, candy; crochet or knit gifts; jewelry; paintings/art
- **Donate** in someone's name
- Remember those handmade gift certificates you gave out as a kid? Do that for your time and talent as an adult!
  - Home cooked meals, offering your professional assistance, helping with a home deep clean
- Recycle old electronics after receiving new ones! Or provide info on recycling when giving
  electronics

### Gift Wrap, Holiday Cards, Packaging

- Use a bow or ribbon instead of wrapping paper
- Make the wrapping part of the gift
  - o Bowls, pots, clothes, towels, blankets
- Tree-less source of wrapping paper
- Magazines, newspapers, maps, posters, old calendars
- Save old gift bags/baskets, ribbons, bows, etc. to re-use
- Metallic/foil and plastic wrapping paper is NOT recyclable; avoid if possible
  - o If it glitters or has texture, it is also not recyclable
- Unwrapped gift scavenger hunt!
- Send **e-cards** instead of paper cards
- Stuff **stockings** with homemade, natural treats

## Holiday Decorations and Christmas Trees

- Use energy star qualified LED lights
  - o Lasts longer and more efficient
- Use a timer to auto-turn off and on lights
- Recycle or swap old holiday lights
- Try light free with reflective ornaments, candles
- Avoid tinsel and plastic decorations
- Use things from nature to decorate
  - o Berries, flowers, herbs, fresh fruit, evergreen branches, twigs, bark, flowers
- Make garlands out of cranberries and popcorn, small jewelry, small stuffed animals, cookie cutters, buttons
- Real Christmas trees are a greener choice than artificial trees
- Purchase an organic potted Christmas tree that is native to your area and replant it after the holidays
- Decorate a tree in your yard
- Recycle your tree with your city if it can't be replanted

#### **New Holiday Traditions**

- Join the Christmas Bird Count and do a Christmas day nature hike https://www.audubon.org/conservation/join-christmas-bird-count
  - Make it a trash collection event too and bring a garbage bag to collect litter
- Plant trees or other types of winter plants to symbolize the value of nature
- Walk around your neighborhood to admire the lights
  - Driving may not be as sustainable, but it is probably safer during COVID!
- Organize a caroling party when COVID is less of an issue
  - Or try a virtual one!
- Offset your holiday travel through <u>Terrapass</u>, <u>CarbonFund</u>, or <u>Carbonify</u>
  - Make sure to turn off all lights and electronics, plus turn power strips off and unplug devices from outlets

- Volunteer for an environmental cause
